NADKC members PLEASE submit your entries early to ensure a spot in the test. We are limited as to the number of dogs that can be evaluated by each judging group and we will only be able to field some many judging groups.

Details about the NAKP are provided in an article later in this newsletter. To increase participation in the NAKP we have established September 13<sup>th</sup> as the entry deadline, instead of June 30<sup>th</sup> as is the norm. The later entry date will allow this year's Derby/Solms dogs the opportunity to qualify by attending one of the first two Solms/AZP's scheduled in High River, AB Canada or Walla Walla, WA.
